EQUESTRIAN LIFE QUALIFIER



At Roxholme Grange, Carlton-in-Lindrick, Worksop, Notts. S81 9AG

All 20 classes are Equestrian Life Qualifiers. To enter a class as a 'Qualifier' you need to purchase a 2010 Equestrian Life Registration Card. These are available on the website: www.equestrianlifemagazine.com for £12. The Championships will be held on Sunday 12th September 2010 at Arena UK, Allington, Grantham, Lincolnshire.

You can enter any class as a 'Non Qualifier', you will be eligible for Tickhill Riding Club place rosette and prize money, **BUT YOU WILL NOT QUALIFY FOR THE EQUESTRIAN LIFE CHAMPIONSHIPS.**

All classes are open to mares or geldings, four years and over, except classes 14 and 16 in which the horse/pony must be 15 years old or over. **NO STALLIONS OR COLTS ALLOWED IN ANY CLASS.**

The highest placed **THREE** exhibitors in all classes not already qualified and with a valid 2010 Equestrian Life Registration card will qualify for the Championships.

RING 2 - WORKING HUNTER - 9 a.m.

1. MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND WORKING HUNTER PONY

Open to pure breeds only. Rider's any age but to be a suitable size and weight for the pony

This class at the Championships will be split into the following sections:

a) Small Breeds - ponies not exceeding 138cms. Height of fences : Minimum 2'0", Maximum 2'3", Maximum Spread 2'0"

b) Large Breeds - ponies exceeding 138cms. Height of fences : Minimum 2'6", Maximum 2'9", Maximum Spread 2'6"

2. OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY NOT TO EXCEED 133cms

Rider's to have attained their 14th birthday on the 1st January 2010.

Height of fences : Minimum 2'0", Maximum 2'6", Maximum Spread 2'0"

3. OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY EXCEEDING 133cms BUT NOT EXCEEDING 143cms

Rider's not to have attained their 17th birthday on the 1st January 2010.

Height of fences : Minimum 2'6", Maximum 2'9", Maximum Spread 2'6"

4. OPEN WORKING HUNTER PONY EXCEEDING 143cms BUT NOT EXCEEDING 153cms

Rider's any age but must be a suitable size and weight for the pony.

Height of fences : Minimum 2'9", Maximum 3'3", Maximum Spread 2'9"

5. OPEN WORKING HUNTER HORSE TO EXCEED 153cms

Rider's to have attained their 16th birthday by the 1st January 2010. The wearing of spurs is allowed in this class.

Height of fences : Minimum 3'0", Maximum 3'6", Maximum Spread 3'0"

Working Hunter Classes will be judged 60% jumping, 40% conformation. Protective boots including over-reach boots, bandages and body protectors may be worn in the Jumping phase of any Working Hunter Class only but must be removed for the Showing phase. No other change of tack is permitted. Spurs will only be allowed in the Working Hunter Horse class. No child under the age of 14 years old may wear spurs. The fall of a horse/pony and/or rider on the course will result in elimination and they must leave the ring dismounted. A water jump may be included at Qualifier Shows and at the Championships. **NO CHANGE OF RIDER IS ALLOWED.**

RING 1 - RIDDEN SHOWING CLASSES - 9.30 a.m.

6. RIDDEN HUNTER

For horses exceeding 148cms. The judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits). The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under the age of 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Small Hunter - to exceed 148cms but not to exceed 158cms
- b) Lightweight Hunter
- c) Heavyweight Hunter

7. RIDDEN HORSE

For horses exceeding 148cms. The judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits). The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under the age of 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms
- b) Exceeding 158cms

8. RIDDEN COB

For horses exceeding 148cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed as appropriate. The judge may ride at qualifying shows and at the championships at the judges' discretion (the judge may elect NOT to ride certain exhibits). The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under the age of 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms
- b) Exceeding 155cms

9. RIDDEN COLOURED

Open to Piebald/Skewbald horses and ponies only, any height.

Roan's, Dun's, Cremello and Palomino horse/ponies are not permitted in this class.

The wearing of spurs is allowed in these classes but no child under the age of 14 years old may wear them.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) 148cms and under
- b) Over 148cms

10. LEAD REIN PONY

Open to ponies not exceeding 122cms. Rider's not to have attained their 9th birthday on the 1st January 2010. To be led by an attendant aged 14 years old or over. To be shown in a snaffle bridle, lead rein attached to the noseband and not to the bit.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Plaited
- b) Mountain & Moorland

11. FIRST RIDDEN PONY

Open to ponies not exceeding 128cms. Rider's not to have attained their 12th birthday on the 1st January 2010. To be shown in any suitable snaffle bridle.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Plaited
- b) Mountain & Moorland

12. BEST RIDDEN PONY

Open to ponies exceeding 128cms but not exceeding 148cms. NO MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND PONIES ALLOWED IN THIS CLASS. Rider's any age but must be a suitable size and weight for the pony

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Ponies exceeding 128cms but not exceeding 138cms
- b) Ponies exceeding 138cms but not exceeding 148cms

13. RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND - SMALL AND LARGE BREEDS

Open to pure breeds only. NO STALLIONS ALLOWED. Rider's to be a suitable size and weight for the pony. Lead Rein ponies are NOT permitted to enter this class.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Small breeds - Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Section A and B.
- b) Large Breeds - Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh Section C and D.

14. RIDDEN VETERAN

Open to horses and ponies 15 years old and over.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Horse/Ponies 15-21 years old
- b) Horse/Ponies Over 21 years old

15. CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

THIS CLASS AT THE CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL BE JUDGED IN THE EVENING PERFORMANCE. ALL COMPETITORS WHO QUALIFY WILL COMPETE UNDER THE SPOTLIGHTS.

Open to horse and ponies. Rider's any age. To be ridden astride or side saddle. Costumes or traditional allowed. To be judged on the overall picture of elegance presented by horse/pony and rider including appearance, conformation and individual show. Judge may not ask for an individual show at their discretion.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Junior - 16 years and under to include Lead Rein competitors.
- b) Senior - over 16 years old

RING 3 - IN HAND SHOWING CLASSES - 10.30 a.m.

PLEASE NOTE The age of the handler for all In-Hand Classes, both at Qualifier Shows and at the Championships are as follows:

- a) Handlers of ponies 148cms and under must be 12 years old and over**
- b) Handlers of horses over 148cms must be 14 years old and over.**

16. IN-HAND VETERAN

Open to horses and ponies, 15 years old and over.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Horse/Ponies 15-21 years old
- b) Horse/Ponies Over 21 years old

17. IN-HAND MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND - SMALL AND LARGE BREEDS

Open to pure breeds only. **NO STALLIONS ALLOWED.**

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) Small breeds - Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Section A and B.
- b) Large Breeds - Highland, Dales, Fell, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh Section C and D.

18. IN-HAND COLOURED

Open to Piebald/Skewbald, Native/Non Native, horses and ponies only, any height.

Roan's, Dun's, Cremello and Palomino horses and ponies are not permitted to enter this class.

This class will be split at the Championships into the following sections:

- a) 148cms and under
- b) Over 148cms

19. IN-HAND HORSE

Open to horses exceeding 148cms, any type.

20. IN-HAND PONY

Open to ponies not to exceed 148cms, any type.

NO MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND PONIES ARE ALLOWED IN THIS CLASS.

Entry Fees: Classes 1-20, £6 non members/ £5 members - per class

Awards: £7, £5, £4 (IF LESS THAN 6 ENTRIES PRIZE MONEY WILL BE REDUCED ACCORDINGLY)

Rosettes to 4th place. Qualifier Rosettes to the 3 Qualifier's in each class.

*If you enter Ridden Hunter class or Ridden Cob class, you may not enter the Ridden Horse class at the same show.

* If you enter the Ridden Mountain & Moorland class, you may not enter the Best Ridden Pony class at any Qualifier Show.

* If you enter the In Hand Mountain & Moorland Class, you may not enter the In Hand Horse or Pony class at any Qualifier Show.

Please read the full rules and regulations regarding Qualifiers on Equestrian Life Magazine website and at the secretary's caravan on show day.

Hats must be worn and correctly secured by all competitors, riders and handlers in ALL classes at Qualifier Shows. Hats must be to the minimum standard, with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Hats marked EN1384, PAS015; 1998, ASTM F1163, BSEN14572; 2005 or SE1 American Standard SNELL E2001, ASTM 95, SNZ3838; 1998. Skullcap hats must be worn with a silk.

All competitors are advised to hold their own public liability insurance cover.

Show canes and whips not to exceed 75cms (30 inches)

Entry money will not be refunded once the entry has been made.

Competitors must enter the ring correctly attired.

Any complaint must be lodged at the secretary's caravan with the payment of £5 which will be forfeited should the objection not be sustained.

The decision of the judges shall be final.

Any competitor not ready when called may be eliminated.

Any rider on lead rein must remain on it whilst in the showground.

Tickhill Riding Club is affiliated to the British Horse Society and is in Area 16.
